Dear Partner in Ministry:

As I write this article, it is nearing the one-year anniversary of when COVID shut many things down, including our in-person worship. It seems longer ago than that, to be honest. So much has happened, so many lives lost, so many connections with each other broken, so many adjustments to be made. I remember being appalled last year that we wouldn't be able to have in-person Holy Week and Easter



services. How long, we all wondered. How long before we won't have to be afraid to be in each other's presence? How long before we are able to hug, hold our grandchildren, visit people in the hospital or nursing homes, how long O Lord?

Here we are a year later and things have improved. More and more people are getting vaccinated. The weather is warming up so we can begin to gather with friends outside. We are able to be together in worship again, though with restrictions. We still need to mask, remain socially distanced and not sing together or have a coffee hour – but still. I am so glad to be with people on Sundays. We continue with just one service at 9:00 am.

However, on Easter (April 4) we will have TWO services that day at 9:00 and 10:30 am. As explained in another article in this newsletter, we are taking reservations for this day's worship. I have had people tell me that the reason they're not coming to in-person worship is that "they want to make room for others to come." By having two services that day, we should be able to accommodate most, if not all, the folks who would like to be here for in-person worship. The worship service will also be recorded and uploaded to our Facebook page and website for those who don't feel comfortable coming out to worship just yet.

So, how do you make the reservation? Call the church or email the church office and indicate which services you'd like (9 or 10:30), how many people will be coming and if you'd like to sit in the sanctuary or the fellowship hall. Won't it be wonderful to celebrate the Risen Lord together – both in-person and online!

I want to close with two prayers written and distributed by "Illustrated Ministry" marking this one-year anniversary.

In March, our Wednesday Bible study embarked on a new study entitled "Making Sense of Scripture: Big Questions about the Book of Faith." We don't pretend to have all the answers, but we do want to share what the Bible means to us and how it may be able to speak in our lives. Some in this group may have spent a good deal of time with the Bible. Most of us haven't read it as much as we might like. But together we hope to come to it anew, as if opening this book for the first time. We would love to have you join us for this multi-week class. Each class session is unique - come as often as you are able!

The Sunday Morning Adult Bible Study, facilitated by Steve Jones is being held on Sunday mornings at 10:00 am. Currently they are studying the Great Courses Curriculum *From Jesus to Constantine: a History of Early Christianity*.


