Dear Friends,

I feel like I'm a broken record when I keep repeating "We've never lived through a time like this." This is certainly still true. The reality of this ongoing pandemic is wearing on me and others around me. One question we've been struggling with on our church council is "When will we be able to worship together in person?" Nobody wants that to happen more than me. I miss seeing you, singing together, laughing together following worship and preaching to a congregation of people sitting there instead of to a camera.

But, honestly, what I want more than "in person" worship is for all of us to be safe. Recently I read about a church in Calgary, Canada that gathered together in mid-March. The congregation worshipped and then had a time of fellowship following the service. There were only 41 people present, they were careful to observe the two-meter distancing and good hand hygiene. Food was served, but everyone handling it wore gloves. The pastor wrote: "We were very careful and then a week later, we learned about the first person who was diagnosed with COVID-19. A few days later, we had the second and third...within two weeks, there were 24 of the 41 people who had been there that day who became infected." I find this frightening, as I am sure you do as well. Our priority has to be keeping us safe – not only our own parishioners, but also keeping safe all those for whom you may be a caregiver.

I am glad we are able to provide worship via our Facebook page. We gather live at 9:00 am on Sundays – the service is then available to watch later on our church's website: www.allsaintsbyron.org If you wish for more worship resources for use in the home during this time of world-wide crisis, the ELCA offers up **Worship in the Home** which is available for each Sunday at blogs.ELCA.org/Worship. There you can also sign up for a **Daily Bible Reading** to be delivered to your email inbox.

We've restarted our Wednesday Bible study via Zoom. It was SOOO good to be able to see and talk to everyone! You can join this discussion any week you wish. We "meet" at 1:30 pm and discuss the upcoming Sunday's gospel reading. The link for this class is emailed out weekly with the announcements. People can call in, if desired. The number to call will be included in the weekly announcements that are mailed or emailed to you. If you do not currently receive these announcements, please contact the church office to have your contact information included in the database for these mailings.

Starting June 7 we will host a "virtual coffee hour" (via Zoom) each Sunday morning at 11:00 am. We miss the fellowship of Sunday morning coffee hours, and this will give us an opportunity to "see" and chat with each other. These will continue until further notice.

Please stay safe, dear parishioners. We are well in our home, and are grateful our niece April's husband, Josiah, arrived safely from South Korea on May 8.

I look forward to seeing you in the Bible study and/or the coffee hours! Contact me with any questions or concerns.

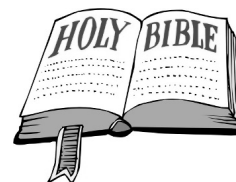

Library

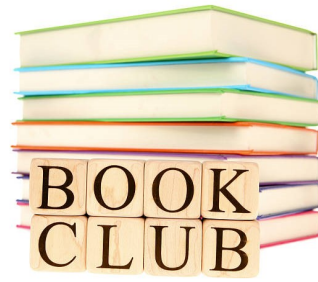
The following books will be available on the library cart by the front doors when the church services begin again.

- ◆ *When I Was Weird* written by Dick and Sharon Provencher's daughter-in-law, Misty Provencher and illustrated by their granddaughter, Sydney tells the story of "Sydney" who is told she is weird because she "never talks" at school. She is sad until she looks at the other kids in her class and learns everyone else is weird too.
- ◆ *The Hairy Brown Angel* edited by Grace Fox Anderson - Would a guardian angel take the shape of a smelly brown mongrel? You'll find the answer to this question and others you may have wondered about in this book. Most of the stories are true, but even the few fiction stories are true-to-life stories that picture God at work through the lives of His creatures.
- ◆ *The Amish Midwife* by Mindy Starnes Clark and Leslie Gould, standard and large print - As her father is on his death bed, Lexie learns about a carved box containing two locks of hair, and a letter given to her adopted parents. Using this unexpected information, she begins her search for her biological family in Pennsylvania's Amish country. She finds Marta, a lay midwife who knows more than she is willing to share with her.
- ◆ *The Dog That Talked to God*, a novel by Jim Kraus - Mary, recently widowed, buys a miniature schnauzer named Rufus, who to her surprise talks to her and to God. He shares advice with her that could make major changes in her life.
- ◆ *The Lord's Prayer*, artwork by Thomas Kinkade Studios. The words of the Lord's Prayer are set to images of the "glory of God's earth and the joy and promise of everlasting life in His grace."



Online Communion

We will continue to offer online communion during Sunday Facebook live worship. To supplement this effort, a basket containing packages of communion wafers has been placed in the entry to the church. There are 10 wafers in each package, so feel free to take as many packages as you need to celebrate communion with your family for several weeks.
