### Mid-week Advent Worship Begins Wednesday, December 2

We will be live streaming the service at the time of worship on Facebook at 7:00 pm each Wednesday evening. The dates are December 2, 9, 16, and 23. This year's Advent worship will feature the DVD *Incarnation* by Adam Hamilton. Because of the licensing requirements of this DVD, we are not allowed to save these services to our Facebook page or website.

Learn the meaning behind the names of Christ and the difference He makes in our lives this Christmas. Join Adam Hamilton and reflect upon the significance of the Christ-child for our lives and the world today!

The live-stream event at 7:00 pm on each Wednesday is the only time it will be available online, so if you do not have internet access and would like to view this DVD, please contact the church office after Christmas to borrow it.





### **Christmas Eve Worship**

Again, because of the COVID-19 pandemic and the restrictions put forth by the Governor, we will be recording the Christmas Eve worship during the week before Christmas and loading it to Facebook and the church website on December 24. This will make the service available to you to view at your convenience. We will use the same worship format with special music, the lighting of candles, and singing "Silent Night" to conclude the service. We encourage you to watch the recorded service at night, dim your lights, light a candle, and join us in celebrating this most Holy night. If you are so inclined, you can take a picture of your family celebrating with lit candles that we can share on Facebook. We will also serve communion virtually, and wafers are available in the entryway of the church. There are 10 wafers in a package so take as many as you need to celebrate communion with your family.

### Dear Partner in Ministry:

The following is taken from an article about Advent I found on **Sundays and Seasons.com.** The season of Advent begins on November 29 and continues for nearly four weeks leading up to Christmas. In addition to our Advent services on Sunday, we have a mid-week Advent service that will be livestreamed on the Wednesdays of December: Dec. 2,9,16, and 23 (see article elsewhere in this newsletter).



"Slow down, dear church. Slow down and breathe.

In this season when the cultural gravity pushes us down the hill to Christmas way too fast, it's time to apply the brakes and slow down. As countercultural as that may seem, there's too much to hear, too much to see, too much to experience, too much to take in to hurry through Advent. We sit with Isaiah and his people who longingly waited for the coming of the Promised One. We stand with John the Baptist as he calls God's people to prepare the way of the Lord.

This slowing down makes room for the Spirit to show us those things in our own hearts and in our own congregations and systems that we might rather leave undisturbed and unacknowledged. The Advent scriptures urge repentance, another practice that is best not hurried through. It may not be pleasant to acknowledge the places in our lives where we have wandered; nor is it delightful to hear a word about a God who has standards and who is angry at both individual and corporate sin. Still, that word stands front and center in the Advent scriptures and begs to be preached in a culture that makes no room for such things.

The Advent season is by nature countercultural... which brings us to perhaps the most countercultural message of all, the message at the heart of the Advent season, indeed the entire Christian faith—that God is about to come, not as an angry judge but as a human among us. This is good news upon which to linger and for which we patiently prepare. Allowing the time to pause here in Advent will reap the rewards of patient, thoughtful, prayerful preparation for God's coming among us." From sundaysandseasons.com. ### **2021 Stewardship Drive**

I'm writing this not even a week after Commitment Sunday. Sunday was the day we asked the Congregation to submit their Statements of Intent for 2021 giving to the church. We had a great initial response as our faithful people came to our drive through for coffee and cookies to drop off Statements along with those mailing them in, placing them in our drop box, going on line to submit and even calling and emailing in their intentions to us. After only 5 days we have nearly as many as we did after six weeks last year, and more keep pouring in. Our goal was to increase our Intentions from 56 to 70 Statements of Intent, and we are well on our way with over 50 in hand and many more expected to follow. Over \$147,000 has been pledged so far, and we fully expect the Statements and Amounts will both reach our goal of 70 and enable us to have the greatest level of intended giving ever at All Saints. It is not too late to fill yours out, so please do so as soon as possible. Remember that if we get to a level of 70 Statements of Intent that one generous family has stated that they will give an extra \$4,000 gift in 2021 that is above and beyond their regular giving. We are truly blessed to have such a generous and loving Congregation!
