

ANNUAL MEETING

Annual Congregation Meeting Sunday, January 28, 2024 10:00 am

This year the 2024 Annual Congregation Meeting will be held following worship on Sunday, January 28. We will gather in the sanctuary and review the annual report, review and vote on the 2024 Budget, elect church council member(s) to fill vacancies on the Church Council, appoint voting members to the 2024 Northern Illinois Synod Assembly to be held June 14 & 15 at Augustana College in Rock Island, and approve changes to the All Saints Constitution. If you are interested in any of these vacancies, please see Pastor Janet and fill out the nominating form, which is available on the oak table in the narthex.

Annual Meeting Voting Requirements

All Saints' constitution lists two minimal requirements to be considered an active voting member at congregation meetings: receive Holy Communion and make at least one financial contribution of record in the current or previous year. "Of record" simply means that the financial secretary has recorded your donation because you have used an offering envelope or written a check.

Blessings to you all in the coming year!


