



December Council Highlights

- * The Fall Stewardship Drive is going well with 51 pledges returned for the general fund and 25 pledges for the mortgage.
- * 2020 Budget was discussed and is ready to be formally approved at the January 13 council meeting. We will then present it to the congregation for approval at the Congregation Meeting on January 26.
- * Discussed concerns about spreading flu germs during the 'passing of the peace' at worship. Participation is not mandatory, but we will place hand sanitizer bottles at the end of each row of chairs for those who wish to use it. Also the use of 'fist bumps' or just verbal words of peace are acceptable.
- * The dead and dying trees along Route 2 have been removed. Stump removal and clean-up will occur in the spring.



Annual Meeting Voting Requirements

All Saints' constitution lists two minimal requirements in order to be considered an active voting member at congregation meetings: receive Holy Communion and make at least one financial contribution of record in the current or previous year. "Of record" simply means that the financial secretary has recorded your donation because you have used an offering envelope or written a check.

Book Club 2019 Review

In this month of January, 2020, we reflect on the books of the past year our Book Club has read and enjoyed. I hope you will check them out and enjoy them also.

January's meeting was cancelled due to the weather.

February - *Something Beautiful Happened* by Yvette Corporon is a personal memoir of the author and her quest to find descendants of the family her grandmother and the people of a Greek island hid from the Nazis during WWII.

March - *Welcome to Harmony* by Philip Gulley - Sam grew up in Harmony and became the pastor of a church in the next state over. He stayed there until he became sick: "I was sick of them and they were sick of me." His family stayed with his parents in Harmony, praying that God would provide a job. Suddenly, Pastor Taylor of Harmony's church died when hit by a truck...and so it begins.

April - *Blood Red Murder* of the African Violet Club Mysteries by Elise Stone - A new resident to the Retirement Community is murdered during an African violet repotting demonstration. Willey falsely becomes the primary suspect and resident Lilliana comes to the aid (not really appreciated) of a small town police chief.


May - *Between Friends* by Debbie Macomber - Lesley and Jillian are friends who grew up in the 50's and 60's. We follow their lives and choices they made through letters, and diary entries from good times and tragic times as they share every grief and joy of their opposite life journeys. (It Includes lots of history from that time.)

September - *Mixed Blessings* by Cathy Hake - Widowed Marie's son was switched at birth with wealthy widower Peter's son three years ago. How can they switch them back to the biological parents and give up the child they thought was theirs?

October - *Shadows of Lancaster County* by Mindy Starns Clark Anna returns home when her brother is missing. She follows the trail he left behind that leads her from the simple world of the Amish to the world of DNA research and gene therapy. When she learns she has something others want, she depends on her instincts, faith in God, and help from the Amish.

November - *Where Do I Go?* is book one of four in a series *by* Neta Jackson. Gabby has lost herself in the fifteen years she's been married to Philip. When he wants to move to Chicago to start a new business, she reluctantly agrees. Finding an opportunity to give her life meaning again at a

woman's shelter in need of a program director, she takes the job. But Phillip doesn't like the changes and gives her an ultimatum: quit the job or risk divorce and losing custody of their two sons.

New Carpet for the Sanctuary

The carpeting in the sanctuary near the sacristy (the back left corner of the church) is stained due to a foundation crack underneath. Doug Knodle is getting a bid (estimated to be about \$1000) to fix the crack and has gotten a bid to replace all of the carpeting in the sanctuary. The proposal is to install carpet tiles – the same pattern as is in the fellowship hall, though in a lighter color. The bid from Stateline Carpet is \$8,128 for the carpet tiles and installation. WELCA has pledged \$3000 toward the cost of this project, and other donations totaling \$1,050 have been received. If you would like to donate toward the remaining balance, please designate your gift "carpeting." Thank you!
