Annual Meeting Voting Requirements

All Saints' constitution lists two minimal requirements in order to be considered an active voting member at congregation meetings: receive Holy Communion and make at least one financial contribution of record in the current or previous year. "Of record" simply means that the financial secretary has recorded your donation because you have used an offering envelope or written a check.

Dear Friends:

Happy New Year! As always, whenever we turn the calendar to a new year, we think "How can it be a new year already?" Perhaps with the ongoing pandemic, time has moved more slowly than before, but nevertheless, I certainly find myself wondering how the years go by so quickly.



We've just completed the Christmas season here at church and now enter into the season of Epiphany. "Epiphany" is a word that's made it into our everyday language. "I was struggling with that problem, then I suddenly had an epiphany of how to solve it." Dictionary.com gives a couple of definitions of the word, including "a sudden, intuitive perception of or insight into the reality or essential meaning of something, usually initiated by some simple, homely, or commonplace occurrence or experience." The initial definition of Epiphany, however, commemorates the arrival of the magi (AKA The Three Wise Men, or Three Kings) who came from afar to pay homage to the Christ child.

The season of Epiphany is marked by light – as the Magi followed the star to find the Christ child, we, too, find ourselves becoming "enlightened" as the season progresses. We'll see in the scripture for this season an increased understanding of who Christ is and why he came. Ultimately, we will learn why he had to go to the cross and die during the season of Lent which follows Epiphany.

We learn that the Christ child is born to us every day and our Epiphany is continuous. The time after Epiphany is a perfect opportunity to receive new insights about ourselves and the God we serve.

May this season of Epiphany be a time of enlightenment for us all. I pray for a healthy, happy 2022 for all of you!

The Tuesday night Bible Study, facilitated by Steve Reid, will be on hiatus in January due to potential winter weather and road conditions.


The Wednesday afternoon Bible Study, facilitated by Pastor Janet Wold meets in Conference Room #310. We will gather for an in-person Bible study on Wednesday afternoons at 1:30 pm. The topic is "Justice, Law, and History." Each week is unique – we invite you to come as often as you can!

The Sunday morning Adult Bible Study, facilitated by Steve Jones is held in the Small Conference Room. The Adult Sunday School Class has wrapped up their current set of videos and embark on a new course with The Fall of the Pagans and the Origins of Medieval Christianity beginning on Sunday, January 2nd. This next course highlights how the pagan world was converted and transformed by the Christianization of the Roman Empire. There are 24 half-hour videos that we will watch and discuss.

The first half dozen session cover the initial beliefs of the people of the Roman Empire. The next nine describe the rise of Christianity and the persecutions and issues that arose. Three sessions follow about the Emperor's conversion and how that spread to become the religion of the Empire. The final six sessions are about the rise of the church

and its' rites, dogmas and the standardization of beliefs along with the final downfall of paganism.

The course is another of the offerings from The Great Courses who have given us many series to learn from and enjoy. The sessions are open to all that are interested and each session stands on it's own as an interesting and informative experience.

As of December 12th, our 2022 Stewardship drive so far has resulted in 46 Statements of Intent and 55 Time and Talent forms being returned. We still have a lot of people to hear from, but the results thus far have been great! Here is a summary on the financial side:

As you can see, we still have responses we are expecting, but the current Statements of Intent show a generous level of giving for 2022. It is always comforting when our intentions from stewardship cover at least 60-65% of the budget. We also have the roof replacement project facing us which will likely cost over \$50,000.
