Annual Congregation Meeting Sunday, January 22, 2023, 10:00 am

This year the 2023 Annual Congregation Meeting will be held following worship on Sunday, January 22. We will gather in the sanctuary and review the annual report, review and vote on the 2023 Budget, elect church council member(s) to fill three vacancies on the Church Council, appoint voting members to the 2023 Northern Illinois Synod Assembly to be held June 16



& 17 at Augustana College in Rock Island, and approve changes to the All Saints Constitution. If you are interested in any of these vacancies, please see Pastor Janet and fill out the nominating form, which is available on the oak table in the narthex.

Now is the time to review the past year and write your report for the Annual Congregation meeting to be held January 22nd. Please include a financial report and a brief overview of what your group has done in 2022. Reports need to be submitted to the office by Tuesday, January 3rd so the booklet can be compiled and made available prior to the Annual Congregation meeting. Copies of last year's report are available if needed. If possible, please submit your report in a Word file and email it to the church. Of course, a hand-written report will be accepted as well.

Annual Meeting Voting Requirements

All Saints' constitution lists two minimal requirements to be considered an active voting member at congregation meetings: receive Holy Communion and make at least one financial contribution of record in the current or previous year. "Of record" simply means that the financial secretary has recorded your donation because you have used an offering envelope or written a check.

Dear Friends:

"On the Twelfth Day of Christmas" "We Three Kings of Orient Are"

What do these two Christmas Carols have in common? They are both referencing the day of Epiphany! Epiphany happens on January 6. It is the 12th day of Christmas - that

is, 12 days after Christmas. Epiphany is the day we remember the Three Wise Men coming to see Jesus, having followed a star to find him.

We use the word "epiphany" in our everyday language to indicate a sudden understanding – Webster defines it as (1) a usually sudden manifestation or perception of the essential nature or meaning of something. (2) an intuitive grasp of reality through something (such as an event) usually simple and striking. (3) an illuminating discovery, realization, or disclosure. It is a "lightbulb moment." This hearkens back to the star showing the way to Jesus – we celebrate the in-breaking of God's light.

"This Little Light of Mine" is another appropriate hymn for Epiphany. Through word and sacrament, we too are invited to rise and shine, for our light has come, and the glory of the Lord is risen upon us. Fed and nourished in worship, we are sent forth to bear witness, to let our lights shine brightly!

May this New Year find you renewing your relationship with God – come join us in worship as we celebrate the Light of Christ! God's blessings to you all in 2023!



Monday afternoon Bible Study, facilitated by Pastor Janet Wold, continues via Zoom at 1:30 pm. This is a study and discussion of the following Sunday's Gospel lesson. A link to the Monday afternoon Bible Study is included in the Thursday announcement's email. Feel free to join us! If you need a Zoom tutorial, Pastor Janet will help you with that. If you do not have a computer, you can join via telephone at the number included in the announcement's email.

Tuesday night Bible Study, facilitated by Steve Reid, will be on hiatus thru February or March, depending on the winter weather.

Wednesday afternoon Bible Study, facilitated by Pastor Janet Wold, meets at 1:30 pm in Conference Room #310. This group of men and women engage in lively conversation over a cup of coffee, utilizing a study, From Darkness to Light.

Sunday morning Adult Bible Study, facilitated by Steve Jones, meets at 10:00 am in the Small Conference Room. Adult Sunday School concludes their current topic of Study on January 8, 2023 and on the 15th they will begin a new course entitled "The History and Archaeology of the Bible." Presented by Jean-Pierre Isbouts, DLitt from the Fielding Graduate University, we will view and discuss 24 lectures that range from Genesis to the Rise of Christianity in the first century. This course looks at how the Bible was shaped by the eras where it came to be written down and how history shows us evidence of the Bible's stories. The class meets each Sunday during the Education hour after Church beginning at 10:00 am. Most sessions are about 45 minutes, with a 40-minute video and short discussion after the videos. Steve Jones leads the class.




