# **March Council Highlights**

- ⇒ Refinancing of the church mortgage to include funds to replace the roof is complete
- ⇒ Donations for roof replacement to date has exceeded \$24,000, reducing the amount needed to finance.
- ⇒ Offerings for budgeted items are still falling short
- ⇒ Roof replacement will begin April 18
- ⇒ Spring Clean-up is scheduled for April 30 with a rain date of May 7
- ⇒ Audit of the church financial records was completed on March 20 with no discrepancies noted
- ⇒ All Saints Blood drive is scheduled for May 23
- ⇒ Sunday School will conclude for the summer on May 22 and begin again on September 11

The Sunday morning Adult Bible Study, facilitated by Steve Jones is held in the Small Conference Room. The Adult Sunday School Class has embarked on a new course with *The Fall of the Pagans and the Origins of Medieval Christianity*. This next course highlights how the pagan world was converted and transformed by the Christianization of the Roman Empire. There are 24 half-hour videos that we will watch and discuss. The sessions are open to all who are interested, and each session stands on its own as an interesting and informative experience.

#### **Book Club**


