


All Saints Sunday, November 6

Tuesday night Bible Study, facilitated by Steve Reid, meets in Conference Room #310 at 7:00 pm. We will continue to look at Bible devotions and how they relate to Christian life. All are welcome to join us for a refreshing insight into the study of the Bible.

The subjects we will be studying are as follows:

- 2. What does the Torah have to do with America
- 3. Walk with God

We will not meet on the week of Thanksgiving. We will go on hiatus after Thanksgiving thru February or March, depending on the winter weather.

Wednesday afternoon Bible Study, facilitated by Pastor Janet Wold, meets at 1:30 pm in Conference Room #310. This group of men and women engage in lively conversation over a cup of coffee, utilizing a study, *God's Exceptional Choice*. There will be no Bible Study on November 23.

Sunday morning Adult Bible Study, facilitated by Steve Jones, meets at 10:00 am in the Small Conference Room. The Adult Sunday School Class will continue with the course The Fall of the Pagans and the Origins of Medieval Christianity. This course highlights how the pagan world was converted and transformed by the Christianization of the Roman Empire. There are 24 half-hour videos that we will watch and discuss. The sessions are open to all who are interested, and each session stands on its own as an interesting and informative experience.
