## Call Committee Update

The Call Committee held its first meeting on Tues., Jan. 7th. Pastor Christine Stienstra, Assistant to the Bishop, was with us to talk about the call process. Mike Reibel was unanimously elected the committee chairman. Discussion included the Northern Illinois Synod call process, the role of Call Committee members and our flexible time line based on the needs of the church. Input from the congregation will be requested as the Call Committee moves into the stage of creating a church site profile over the next several weeks.

The Call Committee met again on **January 16<sup>th</sup>** to begin compiling the Ministry Site Profile. This included examining All Saints and Byron community demographics and discussing current trends, goals, and programs within the congregation. The committee evaluated the leadership style, programming strengths, and theological perspectives of the church. Starting at the congregational meeting on January 26<sup>th</sup>, congregational support will be requested in the form of a survey in order to establish the most accurate congregation profile. This survey will cover "top ministry tasks" and "desired skills for ministry" as two of the critical elements of the Ministry Site Profile. We request the forms to be returned to the appropriate box in the narthex by Sunday, **February 9<sup>th</sup>**.

Please keep the following Call Committee members in your prayers as they continue their work: George Davis\*, Kay Johnson, Rachel Niederer, Cortni Rahn, Troy Rahn, Mike Reibel, and Marlene Roberts. \*George Davis was appointed by the Church Council to replace Steve Jones.

### Church Closure Weather Related

On December 22<sup>nd</sup> 2013, for the first time in 35 years, All Saints church services were cancelled due to the severe weather.

Early that morning I was in contact with various council members and discussed the weather conditions at hand. During the late evening hours into the morning a significant amount of snow fall had occurred causing dangerous driving conditions. I spoke with Reuben Johnson who was at the church clearing the walks in preparation for church services. Reuben indicated the parking lot had been plowed but due to the heavy snow the parking was a problem.

I contacted Pastor Marilyn by phone and determined she was on her way but travel was very slow. Pastor mentioned the roads were becoming snow covered and visibility was very poor. After weighing all the factors and in the interest of the safety of our congregation and Pastor Marilyn, I told the pastor to turn around and return home, and I made the decision to cancel church services for the day.

I apologize for any inconvenience this may have caused any of our congregation. If I am faced with a similar situation, I would make the same call. If anyone would like to discuss this situation with me please feel free to contact me.

## January Council Meeting Highlights

- Welcomed Pete Raum & George Davis and heard their concerns regarding council members serving on the Call Committee. Suggested amending our Constitution with regard to the Call Committee election process in the future.
- Gave approval for the youth to host a pancake supper on Ash Wednesday as a fund-raiser for the 2015 ELCA Youth Gathering.
- Approved canceling our current contract with Integrys (fixed pricing) and signing a contract with Nicor Gas (variable pricing) instead.
- Heard that the ELCA Good Gifts offerings in December were \$378.75 and that the children have selected the animals they would like to order.
- Received 78 pledges in this year’s stewardship campaign, a decrease by three from last year but an increase in pledged amount.
- Heard that pipes froze in the recent sub-zero temperatures and authorized the purchase (up to \$400) for a condensation pump.
- Approved renewing our current Xerox contract for another year.
- Set the agenda for the Annual Meeting scheduled for Sunday evening, January 26.
- Nominated two members to serve on the Mission Endowment Fund Committee, which will be voted on by the congregation at its Annual Meeting – Michael Schlagel & Lavonne Berkeley.
- Approved asking Mary Jo Cassens & Lavonne Berkeley to serve on the Audit Committee.
- Elected George Davis to serve on the Call Committee (to replace Steve Jones).

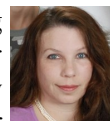


## Families in Faith
