A Note From Pastor Janet Wold

Dear Friends in Christ,

New beginnings...they're exciting, they're a little scary, and they're full of the unknown! I am so excited to have this new beginning with you as your pastor at All Saints Lutheran. And, I would guess, the congregation is ready to settle in with a new pastor too. Pastor Marilyn did such an outstanding job as your interim – I am pleased she is now going to be the interim at the congregation I just left!



Many of you were at the "meet and greet" with me on July 27 and heard a bit about my background. For those of you who weren't, let me take a few minutes to tell you about myself. I am originally from Rockford and spent all of my growing up years there. Raised as a Roman Catholic, I became Lutheran when I was in high school (another story for another day), then went to Illinois State University to become a teacher of deaf and hard of hearing children. I moved to Dubuque to teach and ultimately made the decision to quit teaching and go to seminary to become a Lutheran pastor. I was ordained in 1987 and have served congregations in Waterloo, IA, near St. Louis, MO, Lake Zurich, IL and most recently in Rockford. I am married to Alan, who is a teacher, and we have two cats: Domino and Nikki. Alan has two daughters (Ann and Virginia) from a previous marriage, both of whom live in Washington State where he is originally from. His oldest daughter Ann is married and has blessed us with two grandchildren, Gavin and Calista. Alan also has a niece, April, who has become like a daughter to me – she lives in Seoul, South Korea, is married and has a 1 year old daughter, Hannah.

My family of origin consists of my mom, Jane Peele, who is 89 and lives in a duplex at Wesley Willows in Rockford. My dad, Tom, died this past March. My brother, Steve Peele and his wife Kris live in Rockford. Their daughter Amy Hughes lives in Stillman Valley with her husband and 3 daughters, their son Brad lives in Milwaukee with his son. My sister Kathy died just a month after my dad this past spring, passing away in April. She lived in Oklahoma, where my brother-in-law and niece and nephew still live.

That's probably more than you wanted to know! I now look forward to hearing your stories and getting to know you. Being someone's pastor is such a privilege - thank you in advance for allowing me to be a part of your journey. Thank you for extending the call to me to become your pastor – I am eager to begin!

- Heard Zachary Fortener is interested in fulfilling the remainder of the term for Youth and Family Ministry council seat vacated by Cortni Rahn's relocation to California. His appointment will be submitted for approval at the October meeting.
