

Dear Friends:

On Sunday, April 9th we will celebrate Easter, the day we know that Christ is Lord of all, having become a victor over even death. The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday – a day when we are reminded of our sinfulness by confessing our sins and receiving a cross of ashes on our foreheads. During the remaining days of Lent, we are to reflect on our need for a Savior – we are reminded, once again, of our own inability to be able to “save ourselves” and how it is only through the grace of God that we are able to BE saved!



On Maundy Thursday we hear a word of forgiveness for our sins, and then on Good Friday we are reminded again of the pain of the cross, and on Saturday we reflect on the death of our Savior.

And then comes Sunday! The tomb is empty, and our Lord has risen from the dead! What a victory – what a gift! As it says in the book of Romans, “When we were baptized in Christ Jesus, we were baptized into his death. We were buried therefore with him by Baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live a new life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his... But if we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him. For we know that Christ being raised from the dead will never die again, death no longer has dominion over him.” (Rom.6:3-5,8-9)

The root of our Christian faith is found in Easter. With Christ’s death and resurrection, Christ broke through the bonds of death and made eternal life with God possible for us all. I hope you’ll come and celebrate this with us – our worship time for Easter is 9:00 am, with a delicious breakfast served at 8:00 am. In Christ we are made new – join with us as we sing for joy this Easter!



Monday Afternoon Bible Study, facilitated by Pastor Janet Wold, continues via Zoom at 1:30 pm. This is a study and discussion of the following Sunday's Gospel lesson. A link to the Monday afternoon Bible Study is included in the Thursday announcement's email. Feel free to join us! If you need a Zoom tutorial, Pastor Janet will help you with that. If you do not have a computer, you can join via telephone at the number included in the announcement's email.

Tuesday Night Bible Study, facilitated by Steve Reid, will resume on April 11 at 7:00 pm in Conference Room #310.

Wednesday Afternoon Bible Study, facilitated by Pastor Janet Wold, meets at 1:30 pm in Conference Room #310. This group of men and women engage in lively conversation over a cup of coffee, utilizing a study, "Jesus Calls Us."

Sunday Morning Adult Bible Study, facilitated by Steve Jones, meets at 10:00 am in the Small Conference Room. Adult Sunday School's course is entitled "The History and Archaeology of the Bible." Presented by Jean-Pierre Isbouts, DLitt from the Fielding Graduate University, we will view and discuss 24 lectures that range from Genesis to the Rise of Christianity in the first century. This course looks at how the Bible was shaped by the eras where it came to be written down and how history shows us evidence of the Bible's stories. The class meets each Sunday during the Education hour after Church beginning at 10:00 am. Most sessions are about 45 minutes, with a 40-minute video and short discussion after the videos.



Thursdays at Eight - Four women meet every week for breakfast to talk, share about their lives, and to encourage each other. Claire has just gone through a divorce and is angry. Elizabeth is a widow in her late fifties and doesn't want to waste a minute. Karen is in her twenties and wants to become an actress. Julia is 39. Her life is going as she wished until she becomes pregnant.

The Man You'll Marry contains two stories: *The First Man You Meet* - Shelly's great-aunt's wedding dress comes with a family legend: She will marry the next man she meets. That man caught her as she tripped on an escalator and fell into his arms. *The Man You'll Marry*- After her wedding, Shelly sent the dress to her best friend. But can the first man she meets be the gorgeous grouch she met *before* she got the dress?

Love in Plain Sight contains two stories: *Love 'N' Marriage* - Stephanie discovers sometimes you find love in the most ordinary places like in the office. She is an assistant temporarily assigned to the boss, a dictator and grouch. Stephanie's co-workers, all romance readers, decide he is the classic lonely hero in need of *Love 'N' Marriage*. 
