Annual Congregation Meeting Sunday, January 26, 2025 10:00 am

This year the 2025 Annual Congregation Meeting will be held on Sunday, January 26 immediately following worship. We will gather in the sanctuary and review the annual report, review and vote on the 2025 Budget, elect church council member(s) to fill vacancies on the Church Council, appoint voting members to the 2025 Northern Illinois Synod Assembly to be held June 13th and 14th at Augustana College in Rock Island, and approve changes to the All Saints Constitution. If you are interested in any of these vacancies, please see Vicar Michelle

Wandersee or Council President Steve Jones. Nominating forms are available on the oak table in the narthex.

Annual Meeting Voting Requirements

All Saints' Constitution lists two minimal requirements to be considered an active voting member at congregation meetings: receive Holy Communion and make at least one financial contribution of record in the current or previous year. "Of record" simply means that the financial secretary has recorded your donation because you have used an offering envelope or written a check.

Congregation Council elections are just around the corner at our annual meeting in January. We need at least three candidates to run. Council positions will be assigned to all Council members at the February council meeting. If you have an interest, please let Vicar Michelle Wandersee or Council President Steve Jones know. Council Members

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Dear Friends in Christ,

As we begin a new year together, I would like to introduce (or re-introduce) a practice of scriptural reading called “Lectio Divina” which is Latin for “Divine Reading. I would invite you to read the following scripture two times and after each time ask yourself the following questions:



1. What word or phrase jumped out to you?
2. What question(s) do you have about the passage?
3. What does the passage mean to you today?

Luke 10:1-4

*After this the Lord appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go. ²He said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. ³Go on your way. See, I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. ⁴**Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and greet no one on the road.***

The phrase that is in bold is what jumped out at me. Why not take anything with us? It seems like Jesus wants us to remain focused - to not get distracted by people or things.

I recently attended a workshop called History and Hope with some folks from the All Saints and Shepherd of the Valley’s Call Committees and Councils. We began our time together with this same practice and scripture, and then paired up and asked those three questions. It was awesome to hear all the insights and questions from around the room. The Holy Spirit was present and moving during this time together and was centering us with the work that was ahead of us.

Each church is in the Call Process, and this workshop, set up by the Northern IL Synod, is part of the learning and discerning process. And since this meeting was centered on the theme “History and Hope”, it was a great learning experience for me as an “outsider” since my history only extends to 4 months with All Saints.

We shared our history and our hopes with one another around the tables. Some of the highlights were:

- We feel that the Holy Spirit is continuing to move at All Saints and is working on strengthening our connections with one another, the community, and the world.
- We felt that since a lot of our answers were similar that we must be moving in the same direction.
- For almost 48 years, All Saint’s History and Hope has been grounded in deep love for God and mission. There is a lot to celebrate and there is still a lot to do!
- So, this year, I’m going to challenge you to reflect on your years or months spent at All Saints and answer these questions that we used above:

1. What jumps out to you about All Saints?
(what are those things we do well or not so well)
2. Where do you see God at work?
(what areas do you feel or see God in action?)
3. What are you wondering about?
(what questions do you have about the past or future?)



I’m looking forward to the seeing all blessings that God will continue to bring to All Saints in 2025!

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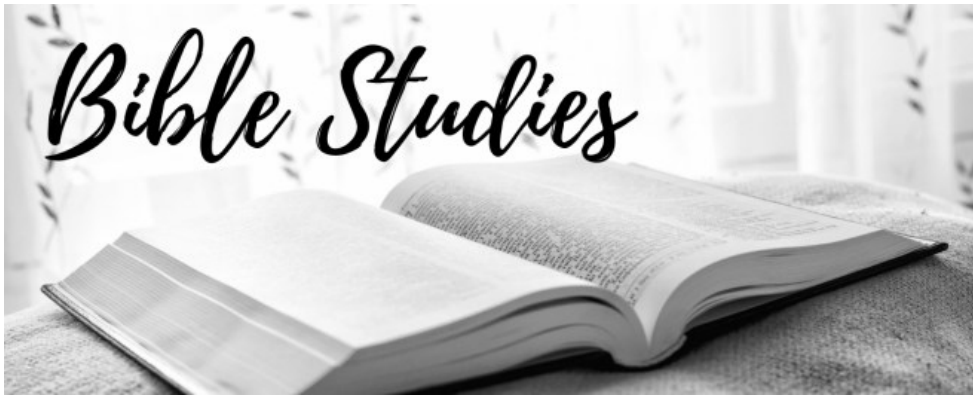

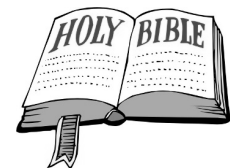
