Dear Friends:

The season of Lent is upon us – Ash Wednesday began our Lenten season on February 14. The word "Lent" comes from an old English word meaning "to lengthen" and it names the time of year when the days get longer in the spring. After the cold, dark and often dismal months of the year come the signs of renewal.



Lent is meant to be a tithe of our time to God. We know that a year is 365 days in length – and a tithe of that time (10% of that time) would equal about 36 days...approximately the same length as the season of Lent. These days of Lent are to be a time when we renew our relationship with God (one of the reasons we add a mid-week worship service) and examine our need for a Savior. Ash Wednesday service is a time of confession – but a word of absolution isn't spoken until Maundy Thursday, giving us time to truly reflect on our sinfulness and our need for Christ to have to go to the cross to die for our sins.

Our mid-week Lenten services are held in person. Due to the copyright restrictions of the DVD message, they will not be able to be recorded for the first four weeks. These began on February 21 and continue through March 20 at 7:00 p.m. For the first four mid-week Lenten services, we will view a message from the DVD entitled *Why Easter Matters* by Andy Stanley. Topics in March include "The God Who Can Be Trusted" and "The Foundation of our Faith". On the last mid-week service (March 20) we will have a healing service instead of a video. This mid-week WILL be able to be uploaded to our Facebook and website. We are again using a service called *Holden Evening Prayer* – it really is a beautiful, contemplative service. Special thanks to Dan and Julie Danielowski, Amy Harn, Caryn Huber, Heather Green, Rory Brown, Alisha Fortener, and Steve Jones for providing the vocal and instrumental accompaniment! This worship lasts about 45 minutes (or less). Each week there will be a free soup/bread/dessert supper at 6:00 p.m. I hope you'll plan on making these mid-week services a part of your Lenten journey.



The series provides a fascinating opportunity to study little known and sometimes controversial Scriptures that might have become part of the Bible.
