Lenten Midweek Worship March 12, 19, 26, April 2 and 9

Greetings Dear Friends,

*Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light upon my path.
(Psalm 119:105)*



It's hard to believe that the season of Lent is upon us! It's one of my favorite seasons of the church year. I used to try the discipline of "giving up" something for 40 days in order to strengthen my relationship with God. I always gave up sweets (except my daughter's birthday cake that usually falls during Lent), or one year I tried to give up eating popcorn. Both the sweets and popcorn seemed like a big sacrifice for me, but I had to wonder how giving up those things brought me closer to God? The only thing it really taught me was that I don't have enough will-power to actually make it for the 40 days.

Then my pastor at the time explained that maybe it wasn't about giving up something that brought us closer, but the adding of a discipline of studying scripture, starting a daily morning prayer practice, attending midweek Lenten services, reading a daily Lenten devotional, or just finding time to sit in God's presence, may be a more fruitful way to continue to stay connecting with God each day.

I also love gathering together on Wednesdays for soup and worship. I've always enjoyed coming together as a community each week to share a meal. I think that's one of the strongest ways to build community. I would like to invite you to practice the discipline of attending our midweek Lent soup suppers and worship services. We will be using a different format of worship this year. It is a resource from the Northern Illinois Synod called "Turning Toward God's Abundance".

Here is a description of the service:

Lent is a season of repentance, turning to God and asking for God's goodness to wipe away our sins and show us how to live anew. Lent also turns us toward Easter and the abundant life God will offer through the Three Days. This Lenten midweek service turns us toward God's abundance by focusing on five divine attributes drawn for the gospel texts for Lent (year C): faithfulness, mercy, compassion, forgiveness, and love. Each service is designed for sustained reflection on the gospel in the context of contemplative prayer, readings, silence, and song.

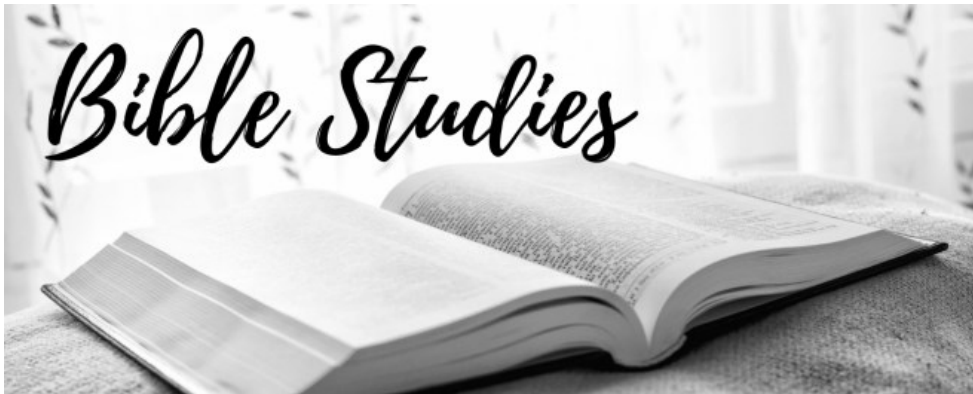
March 12: Theme: Faithfulness
Prayer Practice: Visio Divina "divine seeing"
March 19: Theme: Mercy
Prayer Practice: Sung prayer (Holden Evening Prayers)
March 26: Theme: Compassion
Prayer Practice: Bidding prayer
April 2: Theme: Forgiveness
Prayer Practice: Candle prayer
April 9: Theme: Love
Prayer Practice: Prayer with anointing
(receive a blessing with oil)

I hope you are able to join us for these midweek services as we gather together to turn toward our God of abundant love, grace, and mercy.

Sunday Morning, 10:00 am in the small Conference Room. Led by Steve Jones. Beginning March 2nd, Adult Sunday School begins a new endeavor with *Searching for the Historical Jesus*, led by Jean-Pierre Isboots. Isboots is a Biblical history scholar and best-selling author. We enjoyed his other course entitled *Archaeology of the Bible* a couple of years ago and look forward to this one, too.

These courses are made up each week of a half hour video that we watch. There is no preparation required, and no homework or other work is required (I heard a rumor that someone doesn't come because they feared having homework). After the video we have a good discussion on what we viewed and all that takes 45-50 minutes total. All you have to do is watch, listen, and enjoy.

Our class is small, having lost a few folks in the last year, and all are welcome! We'd love to have you. You will learn a lot and it is always quite interesting! This new course will run for 15 Sundays, so it will run into the fall as we won't have time to finish before Sunday School takes its summer break. Most of it is week to week, so if you miss a few sessions, it's not a big deal at all. Hope to see you on March 2nd!

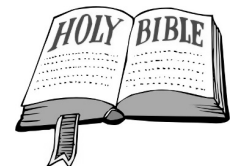

Until we hear back from the Synod, the Call committee will not be meeting monthly as we have since we began this process. Once we have information from the Synod, we will begin meeting again and we will update you as to our progress at that time.

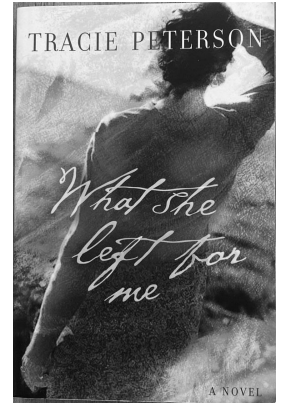
Quilters
