 - ◆ There are 6 lessons:
 - *Food, Relationships, and the Stories that Shape Us
 - *Taking, Breaking, Making All Things New
 - *Provision, Presence, and Promise
 - *Food, Family and Home
 - *Rhythms and Rituals
 - *Signs, Wonders, and Snacks
 - ◆ The first Wednesday’s meal will be provided! I applied for a Thrivent Action Team and I have already received it! We will ask people to provide part of the meal ingredients for each of the following weeks.
 - ◆ There will be a sign-up sheet with a cap of 15 people.
- ***NEW* Worship at the Table Monday evening** in-person Bible study!
 - ◆ For those that can’t attend during the day- we will gather **once a month for a light meal and study!**
 - ◆ First meal is on Monday, September 23rd @ 5:30 pm.
 - ◆ There will be a sign-up sheet with a cap of 15 people.
 - ◆ Same information in regards to the lessons and meal ingredients as above.

I am excited about all the learning opportunities coming up this month! I hope to be able to connect with as many of you as I can!

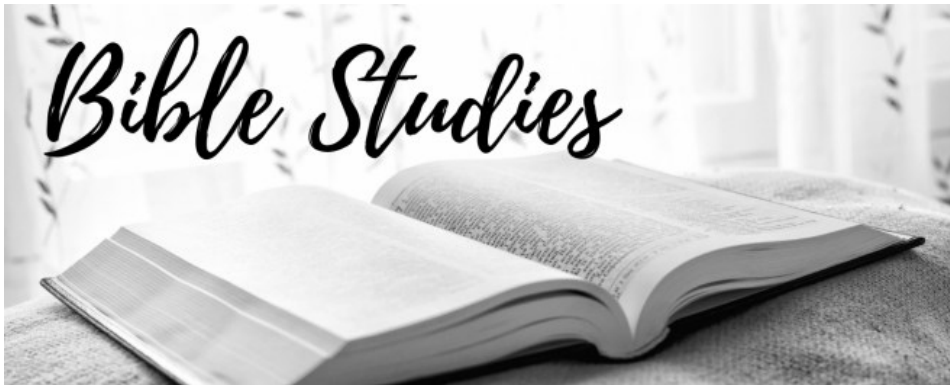

Check the calendar for changes to the Bible Study schedule.

Sunday Morning Adult Bible Study, facilitated by Steve Jones, will resume on September 15 at 10:00 am in the small conference room off the Fellowship Hall. This study will pick up where they left off last spring utilizing *Lost Christianities: Christian Scripture and the Battles over Authentication* with lectures by Professor Bart D. Ehrman. These lectures focus on the remarkable fact that many of the struggles of early Christians were not against pagans or other nonbelievers but against other Christians. The series provides a fascinating opportunity to study little known and sometimes controversial scriptures that might have become part of the Bible.

Monday Afternoon Bible Study, held via Zoom and facilitated by Vicar Michelle Wandersee, will resume September 9 at 1:30 pm. This is a study and discussion of the following Sunday's Gospel lesson. A link to the Monday afternoon Bible Study is included in the Thursday announcement's email. Feel free to join us! If you need a Zoom tutorial, Vicar Michelle will help you with that. If you do not have a computer, you can join via telephone at the number included in the announcement's email.

Monday Evening Bible Study, held once a month and facilitated by Vicar Michelle Wandersee, will be held at 5:30 pm in the Fellowship Hall. 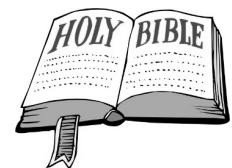

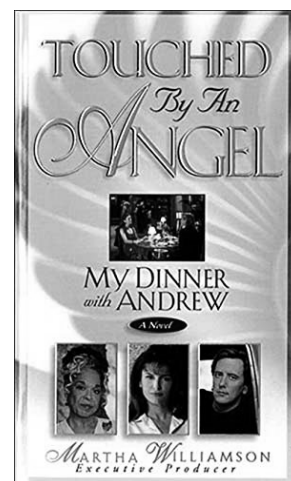
Book Club

- * Light-weight bath size towel (20" x 40" or 27" x 52") - dark color is recommended
- * 2-3 Bath size bars of soap in original packaging (totaling 8-9 oz.)
- * Adult size toothbrush in original packaging (multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-size envelope, no plastic bags or wrap)
- * A sturdy comb (no picks or fine-tooth combs)
- * A metal nail clipper (attached file optional)
