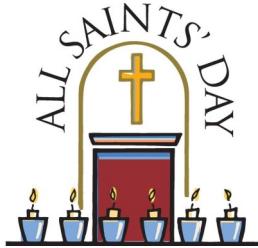

All Saints Sunday, November 3

The custom of commemorating all of the saints of the church on a single day goes back at least to the third century. All Saints Day celebrates the baptized people of God, living and dead, who make up the body of Christ. Our congregation will remember the faithful who have died during the past year.

The book of Psalms is a wonderful place to go when you are looking for words to connect with God. There are 150 Psalms in the bible and they are divided up into categories to help you find what fits your needs. A couple categories are:

Prayers for Help - or laments: These are individual prayers for help and they were prayed by individuals in crisis. Some examples are Psalms 3, 4, and 6.

Hymns of Praise: These give witness to God's love and grace through a call to praise and reasons for praise. Some examples are Psalms 8, 33, and 150.

One of my favorite psalms is Psalm 150. As I read it, I can hear each of the instruments adding to the song as the melody crescendos to the final line "Praise the Lord!" As the Thanksgiving holiday gets closer, we may begin to become more intentional about thanking and praising God for everything that God has provided for us: Our families, friends, pets, homes, jobs, and food on the table (just to name a few). This is also a time where we can feel loneliness or sadness because of the things or people we once were so grateful to have in our lives, are no longer with us. Either if we are feeling joyful and thankful or lonely and sad; we know that God is with us in our feelings. If we don't know how to express to God how we feel, we can go to the psalms and use them as our prayers.

I have so enjoyed the Stewardship videos we have been sharing each Sunday. So today I am thankful and full of praise for what God is doing here at All Saints. I am thankful for all the ministries that you do for the community: hosting Blood Drives, donating to People Helping People, St. Vincent DePaul's ministry for the poor, and the Bryon High School Food Pantry. I am also thankful for the ministries that we are doing for our kids (Sunday school and confirmation), our adult bible study opportunities, and also for the ministries to help those around the world: quilts to Lutheran World Relief, and donations to Lutheran Disaster Response's hurricane relief.

(Cue the trumpets!) Praise the Lord!

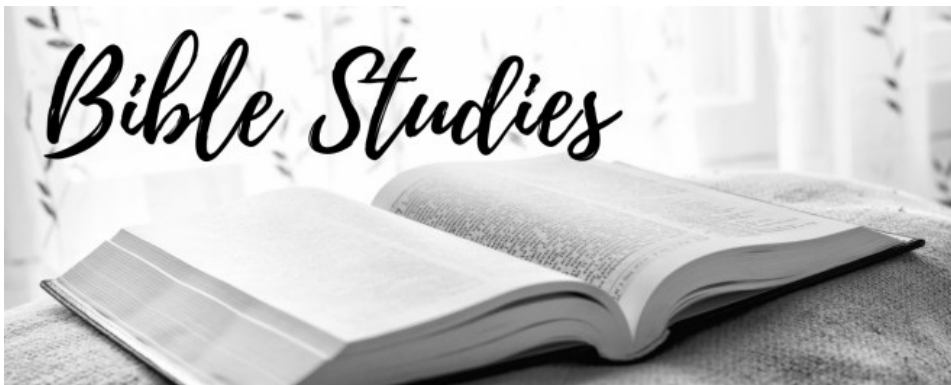

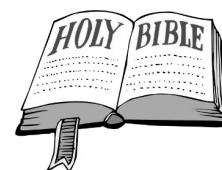

The last two years, we have scheduled mowing every other week due to the lack of volunteers. Next year, with no other changes, there will be two less (Reuben Johnson & Alan Wold) available to be scheduled. To keep the outside areas looking well maintained, we need additional volunteers.

Several years ago, when the number of volunteers dropped, the council solicited bids to have a contractor do the mowing. The result of that was actually predictable; the budget would not accommodate the cost.

The change to mowing every other week was done so that the existing volunteers would not be imposed on to mow more than three times a season which would be a deterrent to keeping them on the volunteer list the following year. So, for those who have faithfully done the mowing over the years, Thank you. For those who have not, please consider adding your name to the 2025 list.

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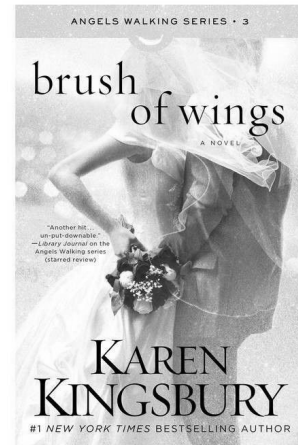
