

The GATHERING will meet at 9:00 am on June 11th and July 9th. All are welcome to join us for fun, fellowship, and food!




Book Club

The Relationship Between the Congregation and our Departing Pastor

Dear People of All Saints,

Pastor Janet Wold's last day at our congregation is June 23, 2024, although her official retirement date is July 1, 2024. She will use her remaining vacation during the week of June 24-30, 2024. As we engage in the time of transition ahead of us, we ask that you read and reflect on the information below. These agreements, as put forth by the Northern Illinois Synod, are important as we all move forward into the future. They reflect the healthiest practice in congregation ministry and will serve both us and our departing minster as we continue to be the body of Christ in this world.

The Church council and Pastor Wold have agreed to the following and seek your cooperation regarding the positive future relationships among us:

We will do everything possible to uphold the mission of the church and the positive quality of life in this congregation.

We will recognize the need for time to adjust to the new relationships and will reach out in care and compassion to one another.

We will honor the departure of our former pastor so duties may be relinquished; and will honor the arrival of the new pastoral leader by seeking his or her counsel and ministry. We are aware that conducting pastoral acts (such as baptism, weddings, funerals, confirmations, communions) and defining ministry programs and leadership styles are no longer the option of our departing pastor, but belong to the arriving pastoral leader with the Council and congregation.

Experience across the Church has shown that continuing relationships with former pastors is very positive when the above things are kept in mind. As we embark down the road with an interim pastoral leader and then call a new pastor, it is important that they become the sole pastoral leader of the congregation as they serve us. There can be no confusion by having the former pastor as part of the congregation. We went through exactly the same process with Pastor Bill as he left and then with Pastor Scott when he left. A congregation has but one pastor and the confusion that could ensue by having a former pastor practicing in any way at the church could diminish the relationship of the interim or new pastor with us. Our Council will work diligently to make the transition as smooth as possible. Please let me know at any time if you have any questions.


