May all of us feel the power of the Risen Lord in our lives on this day and always.



If you do not have a computer, you can join via telephone at the number included in the announcement's email.

Tuesday Night Bible Study, facilitated by Steve Reid meets at 7:00 pm in the Conference Room 310. Please use the South entrance (the Sunday School wing). We will begin the study of the Gospel of Mark.

Wednesday Afternoon Bible Study, facilitated by Pastor Janet Wold, meets at 1:30 pm in Conference Room 310. This study utilizes a publication entitled *Examining Our Faith*.

Sunday Morning Adult Bible Study, facilitated by Steve Jones, meets in the Small Conference Room off the fellowship hall at 10:00 each Sunday morning. The Adult Sunday School course of study is *Lost Christianities: Christian Scripture and the Battles over Authentication* with lectures by Professor Bart D. Ehrman. These lectures focus on the remarkable fact that many of the struggles of early Christians were not against pagans or other nonbelievers

but against other Christians. The series provides a fascinating opportunity to study little known and sometimes controversial Scriptures that might have become part of the Bible.

Note! This study will end on May 19 and resume in September.



Clarice Brisart, one of our new members and president of the Byron PTA, is announcing an exciting program. Byron PTA is raising money to help purchase school kits for kids in the Byron school district that come from low income households and qualify for free lunches. This year the district has 117 kids that qualify for free lunches and 42 kids that qualify for a reduced-price lunch. The average price of a kit for a child is \$60. School kits are bought through 1st Day School Supplies. This year the PTA is reaching out to organizations in the community to raise enough money to provide all eligible children with a kit. This would require the PTA to raise about \$7000. Any help that you can give us in raising money for this cause is appreciated!
