You are invited to submit names of your loved ones who have died since last All Saints Sunday. Beginning the week of October 13, the weekly email reminders will include a form to submit names for inclusion in our prayers on November 3. There will also be forms in the narthex. Names need to be submitted to the office by October 27.

Psalm 96:11-12



The Adult Sunday School course of study is Lost Christianities: Christian Scripture and the Battles over Authentication with lectures by Professor Bart D. Ehrman. These lectures focus on the remarkable fact that many of the struggles of early Christians were not against pagans or other nonbelievers but against other Christians. The series provides a fascinating opportunity to study little known and sometimes controversial Scriptures that might have become part of the Bible.

Monday Afternoon Bible Study, facilitated by Vicar Michelle Wandersee, continues via Zoom at 1:30 pm. This is a study and discussion of the following Sunday's Gospel lesson. 
